



The Pima Air & Space Museum, the Titan Missile Museum, and the Arizona Aviation Hall of Fame are all operated by the Arizona Aerospace Foundation, a 501c3 nonprofit organization in Tucson, Arizona. In addition, the foundation manages the tours for the 309th Aerospace Maintenance and Regeneration Group, the military aircraft “bone yard” which is located across the street from the Pima Air & Space Museum, and the 390th Memorial Museum is housed at the air museum.

Pima Air & Space Museum, 6000 E. Valencia, Tucson. (520-574-0462 The largest aviation and space museum west of the Rockies, with more than 300 aircraft on display on 80 acres and a wide array of exhibits is on site. Popular aircraft include an SR-71, a B-36 Peacemaker, a B-24 Liberator, a Super Guppy, plus numerous historic and rare aircraft. A tram is available for docent led tours for an additional \$6. Pets are welcome. Hours 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Last admission at 4 p.m. www.pimaair.org.

309th Aerospace Maintenance and Regeneration Group (AMARG). Located at Davis Monthan Air Force Base, Irvington and Kolb roads gate. This is the largest outdoor aircraft storage facility in the world, with more than 4,300 aircraft on display. Public tours are available through the Pima Air & Space Museum, Monday through Friday by reservation only. Call 520-618-4800 for ticket prices and reservations.

Titan Missile Museum, 1580 W. Duval Mine Road, exit 69 off of I-19 in Sahuarita. Tours are offered of this actual missile site, the only one of 54 such silos preserved as a National Historic Landmark. Displays include an actual Titan II ICBM. Experience a simulated launch. Tour includes the launch control center and missile silo. Seven stories underground.

The **Arizona Aviation Hall of Fame** is devoted to Arizonans who have made significant contributions to aviation and aerospace history. Admission to the Hall is included in admission to the Pima Air & Space Museum.

The **390th Memorial Museum** is a separate museum that is also housed at the Pima Air & Space Museum. The museum celebrates the contributions of the 390th Bombardment group, which participated in 301 operational missions over Europe between 1943 and 1945. Admission to the museum is included in admission to the Pima Air & Space Museum.
